Junior and Senior Campus

There is a Junior and Senior Campus at Glen Huntly Primary School.

The Junior Campus includes Prep and Grade 1 classrooms and also a spacious library, Before/After School Care Activities Centre, Art Room and newly resurfaced soccer pitch.

The Senior Campus includes Grades 2 to 6 classrooms, reception and the administration offices, an inquiry room, the new full sized Gymnasium, Kitchen, Science, Japanese, STEM and Music Rooms.

Victorian Curriculum



At Glen Huntly Primary School we follow the Victorian Curriculum. It is the framework for which we plan, teach and formally assess students.

In the English domain, we assess all students individually in:

- Reading
- Writing
- Speaking and Listening

In the Mathematics domain, we assess all students individually in:

- Number
- Measurement and Geometry
- Statistics and Probability



Gradual Release Model



Glen Huntly School uses the Gradual Release Model for Instruction as our pedagogical model

This includes 3 steps:

I do Teacher explicitly teaches the skill or concept

We do Teacher and students practice the skill or concept together

You do Students work independently on the skill or concept

Lessons can be a mix of explicit instruction from the teacher, student groups working together in collaboration and students completing independent work.





Literacy



Reading

- Decoding words and placing emphasis on letter/sound relationships.
- Foster a positive attitude towards reading so that your child feels successful!

Writing

- Preps are introduced to a variety of writing genres such as creative and procedural writing, lists and letters.
- Some activities we do in class are: Recount Writing, Handwriting, Topic
 Writing, Poetry and Narrative writing.

Speaking and Listening

This is enhanced through our phonics program 'Little Learners Love Literacy'
which places a strong emphasis on oral literacy skills.

Little Learners Love Literacy

This is a literacy program we use at GHPS to increase our students' phonological awareness and understanding of sound/letter relationships.

Students each week are introduced to new characters from the book 'Milo's birthday Surprise' who introduce them to a new letter and sound.

- Introduction of characters with each sound
- Initial sounds
- Sounding out words
- Blends
- Letter formation
- Newsletter tasks

This is a literacy session in action!








Numeracy

In Prep, students explore a variety of Mathematics topics. Throughout the year students will focus on 3 main areas of Maths - **Number and Algebra**, **Measurement and Geometry** and **Statistics and Probability**.

Some initiatives used to support the teaching and learning of the Mathematics curriculum at GHPS are:

- Number Talks/Daily Reviews
- Anchor Charts and Visuals
- Concrete materials i.e. unifix, numicons, counters, toys
- Extensive Pre Assessment of students to identify points of growth and establish individual learning goals
- Point of need Maths teaching
- Maths Talent Competitions. For example, Olympiad







Inquiry - history, geography, civics



This is another area of the Victorian Curriculum.

Some areas that students could focus on include: local history, civics and citizenships, basic science, economics in the upper school and geography.

Other areas taught include researching, communication, collaboration, thinking and self management skills.



Science/STEM



Students have science once a week for an hour with a specialist science teacher in our dedicated science Room.

Science topics include Chemical, Physical, Biological, Earth and Space Sciences.











Music and concerts





All students have one hour of music a week, taught by a specialist music teacher.

There is a dedicated music room.

There is also a junior and senior school choir and a school band. The school hosts a whole school Music Performance once a year and every second year a concert at Monash University.







Japanese

All students have one hour of Japanese a week, taught by a specialist language teacher. This includes learning basic Japanese and also learning some Japanese culture and history.





Art and the Annual Art Show



Students have a one hour session of art each week with our specialist art teacher and in our dedicated art studio.

Once a year, the school holds an Art Show and displays student's work.

Many student art works are proudly displayed throughout the school.







PE Health and learn to swim



All students receive a weekly one hour PE and Health lesson from a PE specialist.

The teacher can use a full court indoor gym, grass oval, basketball courts, or soccer pitch to deliver the program.

The school runs a swimming program every year for all students.
This is at Glen Eira Sports and Aquatic Centre until Carnegie Pool reopens.









Library

Students visit the library once a week in classroom time with their teacher.

There is also a Library Club that runs on Thursdays at lunchtime.

Each Tuesday morning 9am to 10am, the librarian runs Little Bookworms, which is a pre school story time session.







Cooking

Students attend cooking classes once a term in our kitchen run by our cooking teacher Fiona.


Where possible, the classes uses ingredients from our own veggie gardens.



Digital Learning

Digital learning is integrated across the school in many subjects. Students use both laptops and iPads Some of the programs we use include:

- Computer chess
- Robots
- Basic coding/programing
- iPads and laptops

- Coding Club after school









Social and Emotional Wellbeing

Student wellbeing is a major focus at the school.

Each Friday afternoon the whole school participates in a 'Wellbeing session'.

This is where a range of activities and lessons centred around wellbeing, engagement, respect, resilience and mindfulness are taught in the classrooms.

The school uses and teachers the Department's RRRR Program as well as Circle Time and the Zones of Regulation.























All Prep students are matched with a Grade 5 student at the start of the year.

This relationship continues into Grade 1 when the older buddy is in Grade 6.

Buddy activities may include:

- Story writing or reading together
- Having lunch or morning tea together
- Skill teaching
- Leadership skills for the older buddy







Lunchtime clubs

The school runs a number of lunchtime clubs including:

Learning Support



The school provides a number of programs to help any students that require additional support in either Reading or Maths. Additional support includes:

Interschool sport



In addition to weekly PE classes, students from Grade 5 & 6 also participate in both summer and winter weekly interschool sport .These sports can include cricket, netball, soccer, softball and volleyball.





The school also participates in inter school Cross Country, Basketball, Swimming and Athletics competitions.

Student Leadership

The school has a Student Representative Council from Grades 3 to 6 that meets with the principal 8 times per year at lunchtime, to work on ideas and projects generated by students.

Term 2: Monday 22 April 2024 - Friday 28 June, 2024

- ► From week 1, Term 2, 2024: Enrolment Information Packs are available to prospective families and the school community
- ► From week 1, Term 2, 2024: Enrolment applications open- parents/carers may submit their completed enrolment application to GHPS

Term 3: Monday 15 July 2024- Friday 20 September 2024

- By Friday 28 July, 2024 Enrolment applications due- parents/carers submit their completed enrolment application to GHPS
- ▶ By Friday 9 August, 2024, GHPS notifies parents/carers in writing of Foundation (Prep) enrolment
- By Friday 23 August, parents/carers sent a letter of offer to return the completed enrolment form by this date, to indicate acceptance of their child's place at GHPS

Term 4: Thursday 17 October, 2024 - Thursday 28th of November, 2024

Prep transition 2025



- School starts for Preps on Thursday 30th of January 2025
- Preps finish at the early time of 2.30pm for the first week
- Preps do not attend school on Wednesdays for the first 5 weeks of school.
- This allows the teachers to conduct 1:1 assessments of each student
- Full weeks for Preps start the week starting 3th of March
